SEMINARIAN’S TAKE

Happy New Year!

Today, we mark the beginning of a new year! We often are filled with new hope and good intentions at the beginning of the year. We want to make this year better than the last; even if last year was a good year, we desire this year to improve and be better yet. We make new year’s resolutions and promise to form good habits often around living healthier or acting kinder. Whatever the resolution is, it is one in which we are striving to become better and looking ahead to the future. I applaud these resolutions, but I also want to challenge you and propose something new.

We spend a lot of our time looking ahead, focusing on the future. I propose at the beginning of the year that we should look back. Now I don’t mean to look back and be stuck looking in the past because that’s not healthy, but what I mean is to look back and see where you have come from and to see what God has done in your life. As someone recently told me, you can’t keep going forward without looking back periodically. For example, when we drive, we are constantly taking a glance in our rearview mirror. This is the same for life; when we look back over our life, it helps as we proceed forward. It is important to look back and reflect on what God has done in our lives because it gives us more comfort and assurance of the Love of God. When we look back over our lives, we see where God was at work in our lives and understand where to go moving into the future. Often in the moments of challenge, we don’t see God’s hand at work in our life; only when we look back do we see how He was there with us the whole time.

We can look to Mary as an example of this. Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. Mary is the perfect example of how to look back and reflect over our lives. We hear in the Gospel, “And Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart.” Mary looked back at the events of her life and pondered them in her heart. Reflecting on what God was doing and revealing to her. This is what we need to do as well, not just look back but to look back and reflect. In the reflection, we see God at work in our lives.

At the beginning of this year, I encourage each of you to set some time aside and look back over the past year and all that happened in it and then reflect on where God was at work in your life. Where was He present? Perhaps He was present in places we didn’t expect. Perhaps as a New Year’s resolution you can do this at the beginning of every month. Look back over the past month and see where was God present. This frequent glance back over our lives helps us know where to move forward to in the future. I wish you all a blessed New Year and a Happy Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God.
