

The old St. John's Auditorium on the second floor of the St. Joseph building was where many community events were held. It was where the St. John's Parish Fall Festival was held for many years. Many parish celebrations such as

banquets and receptions including Msgr. Rupert and Msgr. Reineck's 50th Jubilee celebration banquets were held. It was also where the queen (Barbara Mueller) of the Delphos centennial celebration was crowned during the Centennial Pageant in 1951. It is also where school musicals and graduations were held until 1953 when the current Robert Arnzen gymnasium was built. There is a video taken in the old auditorium of the 1951 crowning at the Centennial Pageant on the Delphos Canal Commission Museum YouTube page.

Ticket Information – Home-cooked chicken and beef dinners with all the trimmings are available for \$12.00 for adults and \$9.00 for children (5th grade and younger). Dine-in Dinners – Dine-in dinners will be served in the All Saints Building from 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday. 
