LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

One of the central characters of Tolstoy's *War and Peace* is Pierre Bezukov. Pierre is the illegitimate son of one of the wealthiest men of all of Russia. He unexpectedly inherits his father's estate and title and becomes Count Bezukov and possesses a great fortune and estates. Throughout Pierre's life he commits to finding meaning and purpose. He pursues progressive politics and ideas; He is entrapped in a disastrous marriage; He joins the Freemasons. In the end, all of them leave him empty. After a life of meaningless pursuits, he marries the woman he has loved his entire life and they have a child. What he has learned is a great truth "Where there is Life, there is Happiness."

Many people seek happiness through a manner which can never grant them happiness. Some pursue wealth. Others pursue it through the advancement of their careers. Others seek it through mistaken ideas about life and politics. Some believe they can achieve happiness through their pursuit of progressive principles. In the end, they always come up short. The meaning and purpose of life is revealed to us by God Himself. What is life about? It is about the promotion and nurturing of life itself.

In Deuteronomy 30:19ff, God says to Israel, "I call heaven and earth as witnesses today that I have set before you life and death, blessings and curses. Therefore, choose life so that you and your descendents may live, and that you may love the Lord your God, obey Him, and hold fast to Him."

Soon, Ohians will go to the polls and be asked to make a critical decision about abortion in the State of Ohio. We have been flooded with advertisements that this is about personal choice and about the freedom of families to make their own reproductive decisions regardless of well-established moral principles. Opponents of life will frighten us with unspeakable consequences if the amendment does not pass. Some will falsely claim that they are achieving something good by allowing abortion. However, a classical moral principle that has served humanity well is that "a person cannot and may not achieve a good through an evil means."

As Catholics, we are unapologetically Pro-Life. It is not just in this issue, but all issues, i.e. abortion, opposed to the death penalty, opposed to euthanasia, etc. In many elections in which we participate, there is some moral ambiguity about our choices. However, in this decision there is none. The choice we make has very clear moral implications. There is no "good" that can be achieved by the passage of this amendment, regardless of any noble reasons that Issue 1's proponents may advertise.

I urge Catholics to VOTE NO on Issue 1.

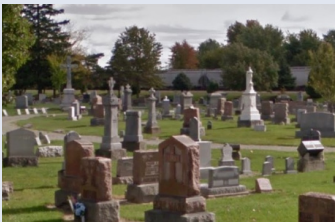
SADD BLOOD DRIVE

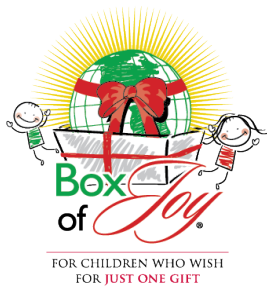

a child who would otherwise receive nothing. Gift boxes and additional information are available in the back of church, and filled boxes can be returned there anytime up through November 10!

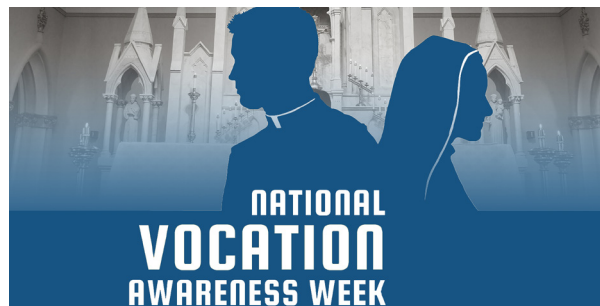

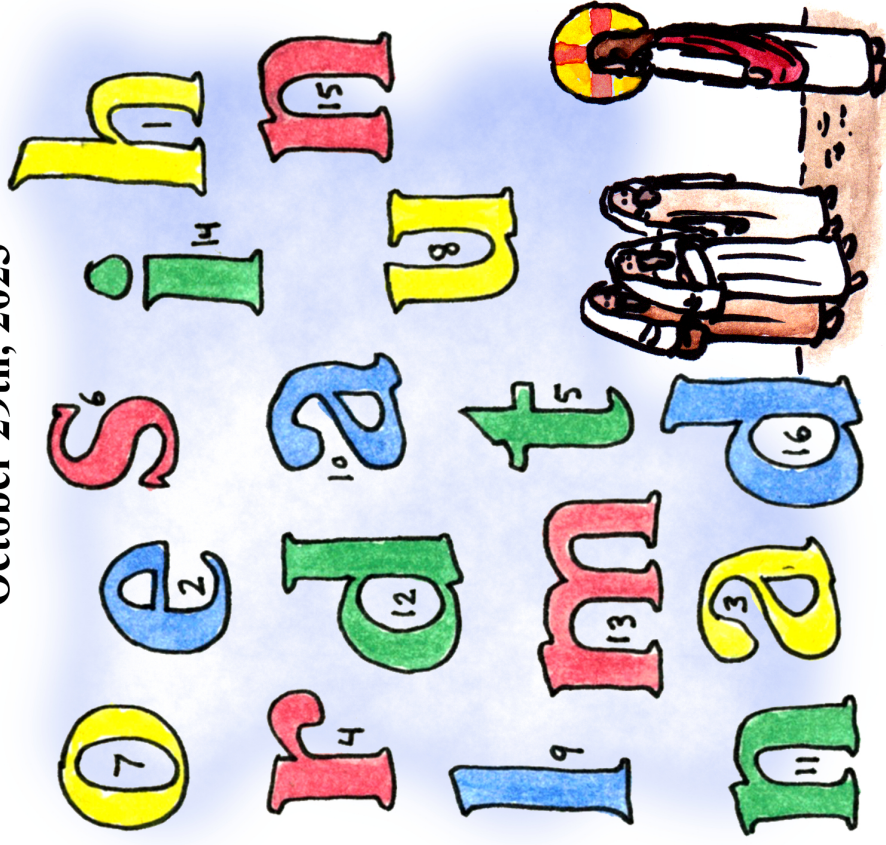

**DIOCESE OF TOLEDO IN COMPLIANCE FOLLOWING SAFE ENVIRONMENT AUDIT**

Each year, the Diocese of Toledo is required to undergo an audit to ensure that it is in compliance with the articles of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People. The past year's audit was a data collection process, examining the period of July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022. Bishop Daniel Thomas is pleased to announce that the Diocese was found to be in full compliance with the requirements in the Charter following the audit.

The Diocese of Toledo remains committed to ensuring the protection of children and providing a safe environment for all young people. If you have any knowledge of abuse that has been committed by a cleric or by any personnel of the Catholic Church, you are urged to report the abuse to your local police department, Children Services, and to contact the Diocesan Victim Assistance Coordinator at 419-214-4880; or write to the Diocesan Victim Assistance Coordinator at 1933 Spielbusch Avenue, Toledo, Ohio 43604.

Job Position Opening Parish Business Manager

St. John the Evangelist Parish (Delphos) is now accepting applications for Parish Business Manager. The position is a full-time position with full benefits.

The business manager provides leadership and day-to-day supervision of the temporal affairs of the parish in such a way as to enable the pastor to concentrate on the spiritual affairs of the parish. The business manager oversees the administrative and business functions of the parish in an accurate, efficient, thorough, professional, and timely manner, which will strengthen the Church and give the appropriate administrative foundation to support the pursuit of the parish's mission, ministry, and growth.

Summary of Responsibilities:

- Assures that sound financial management is practiced by the parish. This includes development and monitoring of budgets; assurance of timely and accurate reporting to parishioners, the diocese and various government agencies; assurance of proper deposit, disbursement and accounting for all parish community-related funds; and oversight of all major fundraising activities.
- Responsible for tracking the financial business transactions that include, but are not limited to: accruals, cash transactions, analyzing financial statements, reconciliation of bank account, etc. Must ensure proper accounts are being charged and accurate records are kept.
- Responsible for overseeing the tuition-related activities of the school.
- Seeks approval from the pastor in concert with the policies, procedures, and guidelines set forth by the diocese regarding financial and temporal transactions; ensures compliance with the diocesan Temporal Goods Policies.
- Reviews budget and financial reports in conjunction with parish pastor, bookkeeper, and finance council.
- Acts as a liaison on behalf of our parish with the diocese and other entities regarding fiscal responsibilities.
- Coordinates and reviews parish organization's funds.
- Performs other related duties as assigned by the Pastor.
