SEMINARIAN'S TAKE

Greetings,

I was deeply moved by the funeral of Deacon Dave Ricker a few days ago. It has made me reflect on the purpose and role of the deacon. I reflected on why we have deacons in the Church, what is their role, and where this ministry originates. I think to understand the role of the deacon, it is important to understand where it originated from.

It's also important to clarify that there is the transitional diaconate, which is for men preparing to be ordained priests. Thus, every priest and bishop has also been ordained a deacon. There is also the permanent diaconate, which are those who have been called by God to serve in the particular ministry of deacon. The ministry of the diaconate is one of the oldest ministries in the Church. In the book of Acts Chapter 6, we can see the establishment of the ministry of the first seven deacons. This ministry has been around since the apostles. We can read that the deacons were established to serve the widows and to assist the apostles so they could better preach the Gospel. Widows at that time were considered marginalized in society because they had no way to provide for themselves. Thus the deacons were to care for the poor and marginalized and to assist the apostles.

If we look at the origin of the word "deacon," it reveals the purpose of the office. The word "deacon" is derived from the Greek words diakonia, service, and diakonos, translated as servant or helper. The deacon is the one who serves and helps. The very word of deacon shows us their purpose, which is service. The deacon's role is to be a servant. This is why, through the Sacrament of Holy Orders, the deacon is conformed in a special way to Jesus, the servant of all. The deacon seeks to live his life as Jesus the Servant. Some of the ways the deacon serves are liturgical. He is responsible for assisting the priest in the following ways: he offers the invocations of the Penitential Rite, proclaims the Gospel, occasionally preaches the homily, reads the petitions of the General Intercessions, receives the gifts, prepares the altar, assists with incensing, distributes Holy Communion, and dismisses the Assembly. Deacons help serve the community by baptizing children, instructing the faithful, presiding at weddings, taking Communion to the sick, and officiating at funerals and wakes. Deacons can also bless religious articles.

The deacon's role is to be conformed to Jesus Christ, the servant of all. Their role is to serve in assisting the priest or the Bishop. Deacons are called to embody the image of Christ the servant; they represent the church in the community, and at Sunday Mass, they bring the needs of the community to the attention of the church. Part of their ministry is to be a servant of charity. They are ordained to care for the poor and marginalized in our communities. They are called to be a public witness to the charity that we are all called to live. Deacons are a witness of service to us. Their actions and life are meant to remind us that we, too, are called to be servants for others. Please pray and encourage our deacons, Dcn. Gene Honigford and Dcn. John Sheeran, for their ministry. Also, please pray for me as I prepare for the transitional diaconate.

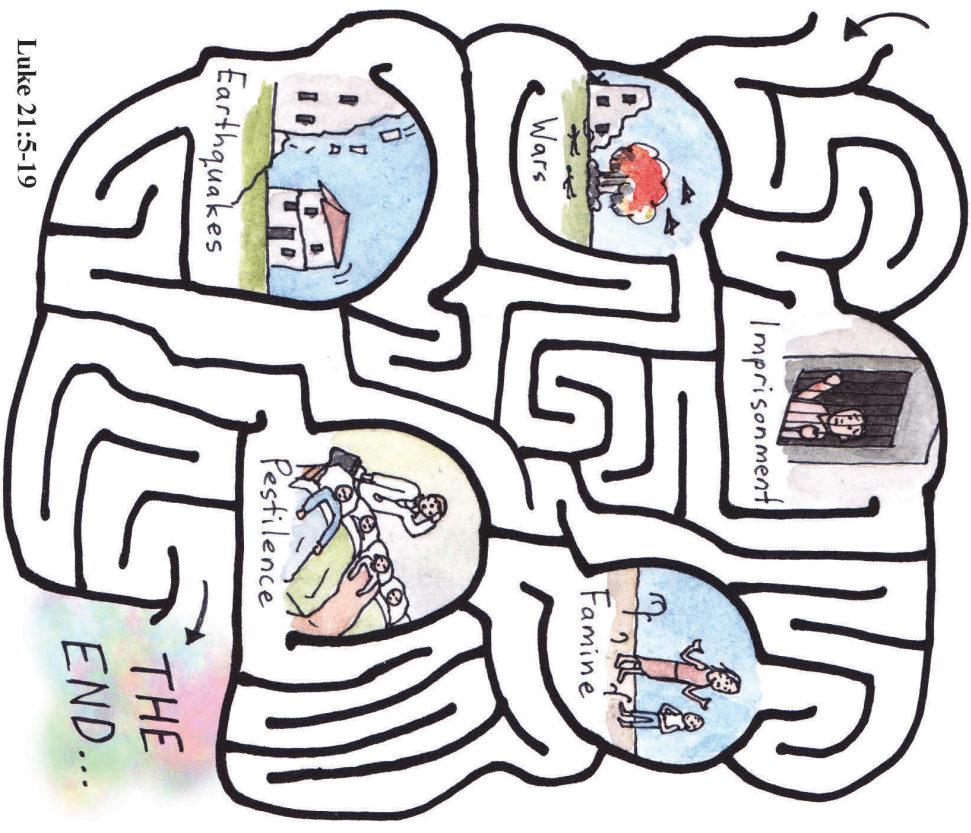

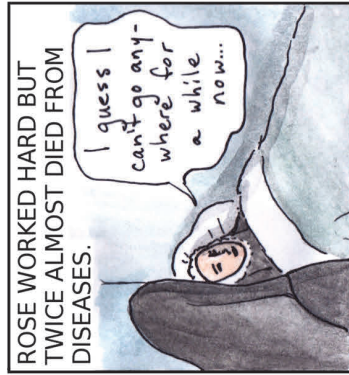

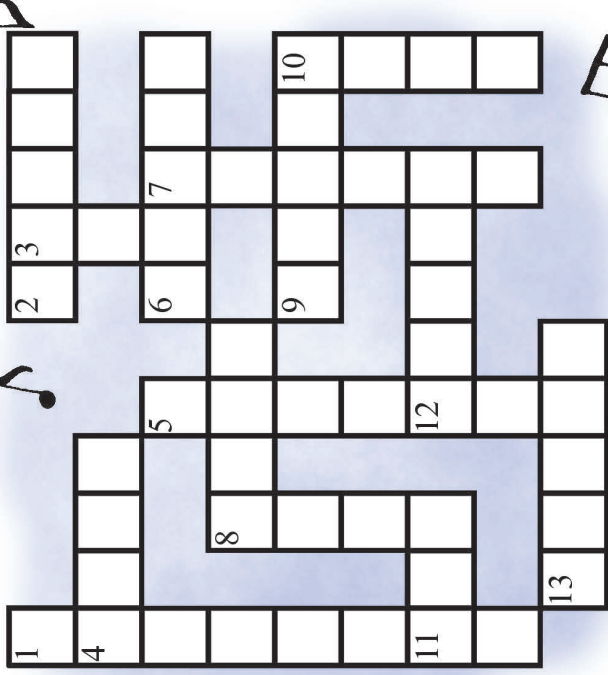
