THIS WEEK IN PARISH HISTORY By: Jack Bockey



Almost 40 years ago, the 1981 history book listed the 14 people who were on the "restoration committee" and the book talks about how a restoration of the church was needed. Eventually, the "beautification preservation committee" was established, and in 1995 a series of meetings was conducted by Bill Brown, a

liturgical consultant who was hired by the parish to help with the restoration planning. In January of 1998, work began and Masses were held in the Robert A. Arnzen gym. The church had some structural issues as the South Wall was "going south." New paintings of the Old Testament were installed and the walls were painted. A new sanctuary floor was installed. Twenty-five years ago, on November 22, 1998, the church was rededicated by Bishop Hoffman.
