HAVE YOU HEARD?!

Delphos St. John's Church will soon be equipped with assistive listening technology from LISTEN Technologies. There will be a "loop" installed under the church and our Wi-Fi will be updated to accommodate this technology for those with hearing loss. If you would like to help fund this project, which is expected to cost around \$9,000.00, contact the Ministry Center at 419-695-4050. Here at St. John's, the Wi-Fi audio distribution will transmit audio directly to smartphones using our existing network. Parishioners and guests may listen via a free app and their own earbuds or stream to Bluetooth-enabled hearing aids and cochlear implants.

THIS WEEK IN PARISH HISTORY By: Jack Bockey



Almost 40 years ago, the 1981 history book listed the 14 people who were on the "restoration committee" and the book talks about how a restoration of the church was needed. Eventually, the "beautification preservation committee" was established, and in 1995 a series of meetings was conducted by Bill Brown, a liturgical consultant who was hired by the parish to help with the restoration planning. In January of 1998, work began and Masses were held in the Robert A. Arnzen gym. The church had some structural issues as the South Wall was "going south." New paintings of the Old Testament were installed and the walls were painted. A new sanctuary floor was installed. Twenty-five years ago, on November 22, 1998, the church was rededicated by Bishop Hoffman.

ON PASSING OF ISSUE 1**

Today is a tragic day for women, children, and families in Ohio. We mourn that the dignity of human life remains concealed by the duplicity of a culture of death. Though this is a day of sorrow, we are never without hope. St. Paul tells us that it is in hope that we were saved and, "If we hope for what we do not see, we wait with endurance."

Asking for God's protection and mercy, we must look ahead.
