SEMINARIAN'S TAKE

Greetings folks,

Last Wednesday, we celebrated All Souls' Day. This Feast Day is an important Feast Day in the life of the Church. It is the day in which we remember, and pray for, our loved ones who have died. Every country has a day in which they remember soldiers who have died for the country or they have a tomb of an unknown soldier. All Souls' Day is in some ways like Memorial Day for the Catholic Church. It is the day in which we honor with love and prayers those who have gone before us. November 1st was the day in which we honor all those in Heaven and then on November 2nd, we commemorate all our loved ones who have died.

The Church dedicates November as the month to pray and remember our beloved dead. The Church believes that we, as baptized Christians, are connected to Christ in love and that this connection in Jesus does not end with death, thus even when someone dies, we can still be connected to them in Jesus. This is the reason that we, as Catholics, pray for the Dead. It's because we are still connected to them.

The tradition of praying for the dead is one that comes from the Scriptures. It is seen in the Old Testament (2 Maccabees 12:42-46) when Maccabees prayed on behalf of the soldiers that had died. St. Paul prays for a friend that died (2 Timothy 1:16-18). The early Church Catechumens often prayed for their dead, as well. This tradition of praying for the dead is a very old tradition in our Church.

Why should we pray for our dead? Well, the first reason is, as I stated above, we are still connected to them. They are still a part of our family, and while they are no longer physically present, we are connected to them spiritually through Christ. Thus, all connected to Christ in Heaven are still connected to us, and we can pray to them and ask for their assistance. We are also connected to those in purgatory. The second reason we pray for the dead is that our prayers help the dead. We are not guaranteed Heaven. We, as Catholics, believe that Heaven and Purgatory and Hell exist. A soul will go to Heaven if they are in a perfect state of grace. Purgatory is a place where a soul is purified and prepared for Heaven. Our prayers help those who are being purified in Purgatory. It can shorten the time of purgatory for a soul. Thus, our prayers are immensely helpful to the soul that has died and is in purgatory.

The thing to remember is that we are still connected with our loved ones because we are connected to them in Christ. The Eucharist now is our closest connection to our loved ones. The Eucharist, which is the presence of Jesus, is how we are connected to our departed loved ones. The whole Church is united in the Eucharist. The whole Church includes the Church Triumphant (those in heaven), Church Suffering (those in purgatory), and Church Militant (those on earth). The Eucharist unites the whole Church together, thus in the Eucharist, we are still united with our loved ones. This November, I encourage you in a special way to remember in prayer our beloved who have died.

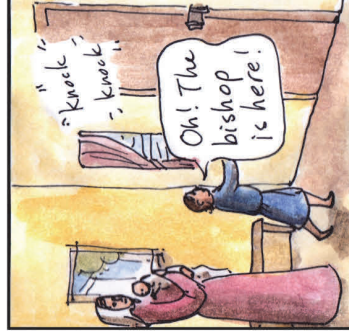
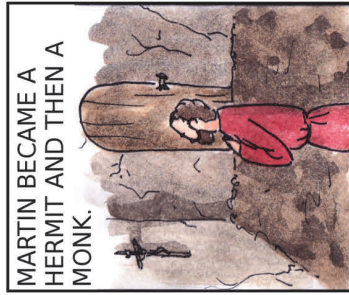
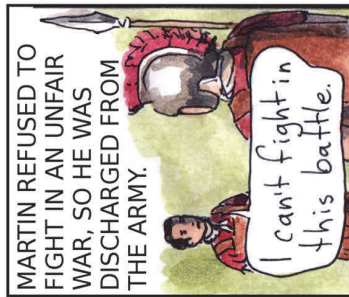
