SEMINARIAN'S TAKE

Greetings,

We are in the last week of Advent, which means it's a week away from Christmas! If your family is anything like mine, that means at this point you are doing the last-minute preparations with a thousand thoughts running through your head. It can be challenging at this point to feel spiritually ready for Christmas – for the great coming of Christ. So, how can we calm ourselves and find time to prepare for Christmas spiritually?

In the last seven days leading up to Christmas, the Church provides us with the O Antiphons to help us prepare. You may be familiar with these Antiphons because the hymn "O come, O come Emmanuel" is based on them. The O Antiphons are ancient verses that Christians have been praying for over 1,300 years, invoking the coming of Christ. The antiphons accompany the Magnificat canticle of Evening Prayer or before the Gospel in Mass from December 17-23. They are verses that use ancient biblical imagery drawn from the Messianic hopes of the Old Testament to proclaim the coming of Christ as the fulfillment not only of Old Testament hopes, but present ones, as well. They are called the O Antiphons because each verse begins with the exclamation, "O." Each day, they repeat this cry of longing, "O come," embodying the desire for the Messiah to come into our lives. These antiphons address Christ with seven magnificent Messianic titles, based on the Old Testament prophecies and types of Christ. Each title is asking Christ to come in a particular way.

My last recommendation is that amidst the busyness of the week leading up to Christmas, when it's sometimes hard to pray, use these O Antiphons as your prayer. For example, on December 17, ask "O wisdom of God come! Come into my life and give me wisdom to know and love you!" Throughout the day, you can say "O wisdom of God, come!" On each day, use the antiphon as your prayer and think about what each title of Christ means. In these last days before Christmas, let's increase in our hearts the longing for Christ's coming. "O Emmanuel, Come!"

- *December 17:* O Wisdom of our God Most High, guiding creation with power and love: come to teach us the path of knowledge!
- *December 18:* O Lord of the House of Israel, giver of the Law to Moses on Sinai: come to rescue us with your mighty power!
- *December 19:* O Root of Jesse's stem, sign of God's love for all his people: come to save us without delay!
- *December 20:* O Key of David, opening the gates of God's eternal Kingdom: come and free the prisoners of darkness!
- *December 21:* O Radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice: come and shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death.
- *December 22:* O King of all nations and keystone of the Church: come and save man, whom you formed from the dust!

December 23: O Emmanuel, our King and Giver of Law: come to save us, Lord our God!

THIS WEEK IN PARISH HISTORY By: Jack Bockey

In 1850, the Sisters of Notre Dame were founded by Sr. Mary Aloysia (Hillogonde Wolbring) and Sr. Maria Ignatia (Elizabeth Kuhling). The sisters came to America in 1874 and headed to Cleveland, Ohio. In Cleveland, they met Fr. Westerholt, our

second pastor and pastor of St. Peter parish in Cleveland at the time. Here at Delphos, the Sisters of St. Francis left and the parish had no one to teach in the school. Fr. Hoeffel spoke with Fr. Westerholt about the situation. On August 2, 1876, Sr. Mary Aloysia and seven other sisters arrived in Delphos.

PARKING IN FRONT OF CHURCH

On November 14, ODOT (Ohio Department of Transportation) rerouted State Route 66 through Franklin Street. The traffic for Route 66 passes directly in front of the Church. This detour will last approximately 210 days. This will result in increased traffic in front of the Church. As a safety precaution, the city has asked that pull-in parking along Franklin Street be eliminated. We are sorry for the inconvenience.

PEACE LIGHT FROM BETHLEHEM

For over a thousand years, lamps have been continuously lit in the Grotto of the Nativity in Bethlehem, Israel. Each year in late November, a child from Austria lights a lantern from the burning candle at the site of Jesus' birth. The light, known as the Peace Light, stored in special explosion-proof lanterns, is then flown with a safety adviser back to Vienna, Austria, where it is shared with delegations from across Europe who distribute it with a message of Peace to their own countries for use at ecumenical services. The Peace Light, symbolic of the Light of Christ especially evident at Christmas, is meant to promote peace, harmony and unity among all people of the world regardless of race, ethnicity or creed. Scouting organizations then take the light to houses of worship, hospitals, homeless shelters, nursing homes, and places of public, cultural and political importance – to anyone who appreciates the significance of the "gift."

In early December, Austrian Airlines representatives transport the Peace Light from Austria to New York City's JFK International Airport. A distribution ceremony is held at the airport's Our Lady of the Skies Chapel to welcome the light of peace to North America. The light's pilgrimage across the U.S. begins from New York City via volunteers, many of whom are Scouts and Scouters associated with the Boy Scouts of America and Girl Scouts of the USA, transferring and sharing it in their communities. Many other dedicated volunteers meet, share, and move the Light across North America, person-to-person, coast-to-coast. The Peace Light is a sign of hope. It has expanded from a small flame to a sea of lights in a few years and shines with its message to millions of people worldwide.

The Peace Light arrived at Delphos St. John's parish on Tuesday, December 6. The light is located in front of the St. Joseph Statue. Candles are available for a \$2.00 donation for community members to take the Peace Light home. It will continue to burn in the church throughout the Christmas season. Please feel free to come and share in the peace this light symbolizes.




