SEMINARIAN'S TAKE

Greetings all,

Today we hear in the Gospel "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" What is this all about? Everything the Church gives us, she gives us for a reason. So when we hear "repent" in the second week of Advent, we hear it for a reason. Why do we hear "repent"? Preparing for Christmas is supposed to be a joyful time so why should we repent? Is Advent supposed to be a penitential season like Lent?

The Church is clear about its penitential seasons: "The penitential days and times in the universal Church are every Friday of the whole year and the season of Lent." (CCC 1250) So that doesn't include Advent (except for Fridays). The Church says Advent is marked as "a period of devout and expectant delight." So what is this repenting all about?

Let's look at the word *repent*. The word "Repent" in Greek is "Metanoieite," and it carries with it the idea of "Changing your mind," to "Change your whole way of thinking." Think again, rethink this thing. Well, Advent is not a time of penance, but it is a time of preparation. So this *repent* is about a call to change, to change our lives so that we are prepared. Advent is about preparing our hearts for Christ's coming at Christmas and His Second coming at the end.

We don't know when Christ will come again but we are called to live like we are always ready for Him to come. This time of Advent is meant to be a reminder for us, to examine our lives to see if we are actually living like we are ready for the end. If we examine our life and are honest we are probably not living like we are ready for the Kingdom of God to come. So this is why we are told to repent. It is a call to change our thinking to remember that Christ will come again in glory and will judge the world, and He will bring everlasting peace.

So, what does repenting look like? How do we do it? Well, first, amidst the business of life we should set time aside and do a self-examination. To pause and to see how are we living and how are we thinking. Then perhaps take advantage of the Day of Grace and go to Confession. The Day of Grace is a time to repent, to change our thinking so that we are prepared for Christ. No matter where we are in life, Advent is a time to reflect and repent – to change. It's a time to be redeemed as we prepare for the coming of the Redeemer. This repenting that we hear is all about calling us to change, to be ready, to be prepared for Christ's coming. So let us repent, for the Kingdom of God is at hand!

The Days of Grace are posted below for each parish. There will be a priest in the confessional at the beginning of every hour for as long as necessary.

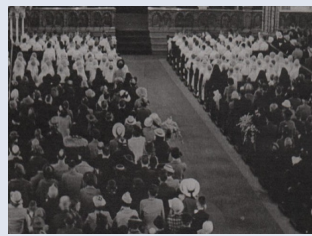
PARKING IN FRONT OF CHURCH

During the 1950 renovation when the current floor was installed, the pews were replaced and moved further apart and a break was added. In 1998, pews at the front and sides were removed and the break was enlarged.

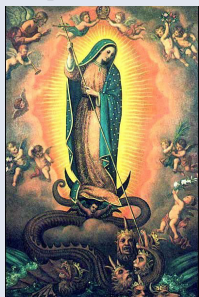

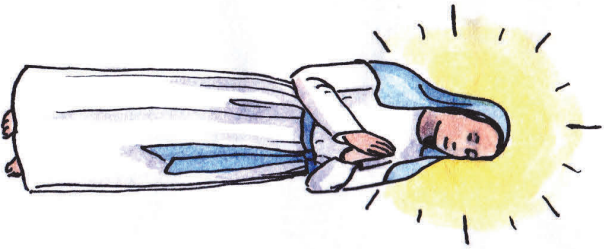

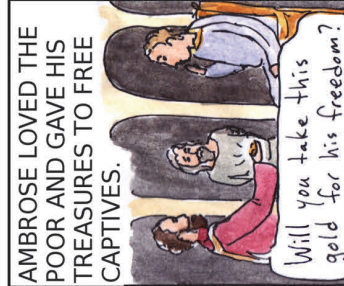
