THIS WEEK IN PARISH HISTORY *By: Jack Bockey*

Fr. Hoeffel, our 3rd pastor, came from Defiance on January 28, 1868. He traveled in a horse-drawn sleigh on the ice-covered canal! Fr. Aloysius I. Hoeffel was born in France in 1832. He built the German Department School in 1868, the current church in 1879-1881, the St. Mary School building in 1888, and his last project, the rectory (now the convent) in 1905. Fr. Hoeffel died in the rectory on September 5, 1909.

SEMINARIAN'S TAKE

This week (February 7th-14th) is National Marriage Week and Sunday, the 12th, is National Marriage Day. I thought it would be a great opportunity to speak about marriage. I know what you are thinking, the guy who is not married and has spent the last 7 years of his life with books is going to talk to me about marriage. It is true. I do not have first-hand experience, so rather I want to provide you with some of the theology of marriage, to provide words to a vocation that many of you are already living. Hopefully, this can provide a deeper insight into what you already know.

Marriage is a beautiful sacrament that is a deep mystery, while at the same time being very simple. When I say that it is simple, I don't mean easy. I mean that it is simple because on the surface it's a man and a woman who profess that they love each other and promise to do so for life. It's a mystery because two people coming from two different backgrounds are bound together and become one. They become a symbol of the love of God to the whole world. The love a couple share is meant to show the world what God's love is like. This is one of the reasons that marriage is a sacrament. A sacrament as we remember is an outward sign of a deep interior reality. So the love of a couple is the outward sign of the deep interior reality of God's love.

There are four realities that a married man and woman's love is meant to make known about God's love:

A couple's love is forever. A couple shows us through their love that God's love is forever. When a husband and wife proclaim their vows of love to each other, they are not temporary. They are proclaiming a love that is forever binding no matter what mess comes with life. When a couple enters into marriage, they don't promise to be together till it doesn't work anymore or until they get bored and the emotional love dries out, or until the kids grow up. No, it's a promise of love forever. No matter the scandal or the heartache the love remains (not the emotion, but the choice of love) because it's forever. Their steadfast love that survives the storms of life reminds us of the love God has for each of us; it is a love that does not waver or give up, no matter the sin.

A couple's love is life-giving. A couple's love which brings forth children shows us that the Love of God is to bring forth life. The love within marriage is never meant to be in isolation, it is always meant to be shared. The proof of this is children which are the result of shared love. This love is so great within a couple that it brings forth a life. Just think how amazing is that! This kind of love pictures for us the love of God; which when we share in, it brings forth eternal life. The love of God is meant to bring us to life.

A couple's love is without conditions. God's unconditional love is made manifest in the unconditional love of a husband and wife. The love shared in marriage is a love that has no limitations or ultimatums. The love is not one that will be given if x, y, or z occurs, it is a love that is given no matter what occurs. There are no predetermined conditions for this love to occur, this is a limitless love that remains true even when it is hard. This unconditional love is the same as the love God has for each of us. We are each loved unconditionally by God, no matter what. There are no contracts or qualifications on God's love. It is free and unconditional.

A couple's love is self-sacrificial. This is the most important aspect of a couple's love, because without self-sacrifice, love cannot truly occur. Love can never be self-focused, because then it's not true love. Love is meant to be given, and sometimes that giving hurts and is incredibly hard. No marriage is easy. Every marriage comes with trials, but it is in these trials when a husband and wife give of themselves for the love of the other. It is in this that we see the greatest love. This love immediately reminds us of the love of God upon the cross when He pours Himself out for us. A couple's marriage is meant to remind us of the love of God on the cross, a love that is so great that it sacrifices itself for the love of the other.

I am convinced that marriage is perhaps the hardest vocation at times. In the priesthood, the sacrifice is made upfront. I know what I am giving up. While in marriage, the sacrifice comes later in life, and it's one that you might not have known fully at the time of marriage. That being said, I think that marriage is a bold and daring vocation. One that is just as counter-cultural at times as the priesthood. It is staying committed for life to one person and sacrificing yourself for the love of that one person. Marriage is a great love; one that we in the world so desperately need to see today. I ask that you thank those couples in your life who have given you this witness through their many years of marriage.

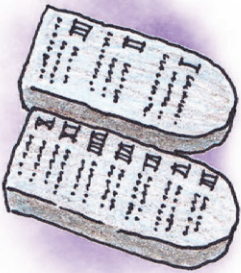
