FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT FEBRUARY 26, 2023

SEMINARIAN'S TAKE

Hi All,

Last week, I mentioned some possible practices for Lent that you could incorporate into your life. I organized these possible practices under the three pillars of Lent: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. This week, I want to discuss why those are the three traditional practices that we perform during Lent.

These ideas of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving come from Matthew's Gospel in Chapter 6 on the Sermon on the Mount. In the Gospel, Jesus is instructing His disciples how to live lives of holiness. These are three ways that Jesus prescribed in order to become perfect like our heavenly Father. Thus, I think that it is appropriate to look more closely at these three practices to understand why they are so important in the Christian way of life. Prayer: Prayer is conversation with God. In prayer, we draw closer in our relationship with God. Prayer is the foundation of the Christian life, for it is through prayer that we encounter Jesus. We cannot grow in holiness without God and it's through prayer that we are able to know God and communicate with Him. Thus, prayer is the cornerstone of our Lenten journey and is vital to all of our actions in life. Prayer is essential for fasting and almsgiving because prayer gives us the strength to fast and act with charity. Fasting & Abstinence: Fasting and abstinence are old traditions in Judeo-Christian history and early Lenten practice. Found in the Scriptures, they offer a way of growing closer to God. Fasting increases our longing for God. Our fasting is meant to have a spiritual aspect to it. When we fast from food, we feel hungry; this physical hunger is meant to make us spiritually hungry for God. Abstinence is restraining oneself from indulging in pleasures. One can abstain from things that are enjoyable but not good, for example, one can abstain from gossip or cussing. Abstinence is about self-control. Fasting can be done in two ways: we can give up things we like or that make us comfortable and offer the discomfort as a sacrifice for someone or something. The other way we fast is the traditional way of fasting from food which the Church asks us to do on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The Church's guidelines for fasting are as follows:

- Individuals between the ages of 18 and 59 are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by having only one full meal and two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal
- All over the age of 14 are required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Fridays during Lent.

Almsgiving: Almsgiving is a response to God, one that we can come to through prayer and fasting. It is a way to live out our gratitude for all that God has given us, reflecting the realization that we are the Body of Christ, responsible for each other. The Lenten call to almsgiving means making the needs of other people our own. One of the central lessons of the cross is compassion; the heavy burdens we carry help us to appreciate the suffering in others. Sharing our material goods is often just the beginning of real Christian giving. We are also called to share our time, tending to people in need. We, as Christians, cannot be self-absorbed; we must look beyond ourselves and our desires and see the needs and sufferings of others.

Ultimately, the goal of these three practices – even the goal of Lent itself – is to conform your life to Christ. We are meant to draw closer to the heart of Jesus and prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are the means by which we do that.

In today's Gospel story, Jesus goes out into the desert to fast and pray for forty days. In the forty days

of Lent, the Church asks us to fast, give alms, and pray.



In Lent we don't eat meat on Fridays. Many people give up things like candy or dessert for all of Lent. When we give up food that we like, it reminds us that food isn't the only thing we need- we need God too!

Giving alms means giving money or things to the poor or the Church. God lets there be people who need our help so that we can become better by helping them!

The third thing that we should do in Lent is praying. You could say an extra prayer every day- maybe an "Our Father" or a "Hail Mary" when you wake up or before you go to bed. Another good idea is reading a bit from the Bible, because when we read the Bible we let God speak to us.


What are some little things you could do for Lent? Try to do things that will help you think a bit more about God every day.
