THIS WEEK IN PARISH HISTORY *By: Jack Bockey*

Two of the original confessionals were located in the North & South transepts. Two more were located at the back of the church. They were installed in 1882. They were replaced in 1944 and were all moved to the back where they were until the present confessionals were installed in 1998. The confessionals that were installed in 1944 are now used for storage in the basement. Confession times are currently: Friday at 7:30 a.m. and Saturday at 3:30 p.m. or by appointment.

SEMINARIAN'S TAKE

Hi folks,

Last Friday the 3rd was the feast of St. Blaise. Traditionally with this feast comes the blessing of throats. Have you ever wondered what is the reason for this? What's the story behind it all?

Well, there are not many facts known about the life of St. Blaise. What we do know is that he was a bishop in the 4th century in the city of Sebaste, Western Armenia. We know that he was imprisoned and tortured for the faith and ultimately died a martyr by being beheaded in 316 A.D. He is recorded to have been a physician and was regarded as a righteous man. Beyond this everything we know comes from traditions.

It is thought that he came from a wealthy family who sent him off to receive an education, and he is recorded as acting as a physician. He was elected a bishop at a young age in Sebaste. He left to become a hermit but was caught by men who supported Emperor Licinius. Licinius was continuing the persecution of Christ's followers despite signing the Edict of Milan. In the year 316, St. Blaise would become a victim of Licinius' hostility against Christians. Blaise was captured and imprisoned by a governor who insisted that the bishop renounce his faith and when he wouldn't, the governor had him beaten, tortured with an iron comb (a tool used for combing wool), and ultimately beheaded.

There are stories of miracles surrounding St. Blaise that have been passed down throughout history. One such miracle for which he is most known, occurred when a mother pleaded for Blaise to cure her son who was dying from a fish bone lodged in his throat. Blaise prayed over the boy, and the child was healed.

Blaise became a popular saint invoked for the protection of health, especially for protection from sickness of the throat partly because of this miracle and partly because he was a physician.

It's an ancient custom of the Church to bless the sick, rooted in the ministry of Christ and His apostles. The annual blessing of throats is a traditional sign of the struggle against illness in the life of the Christian. The blessing is done with candles that were blessed on February 2nd which is the feast of The Presentation of the Lord, also called Candlemas. Devotions like walking the Stations of the Cross during Lent, receiving ashes on Ash Wednesday, kissing the cross on Good Friday, and getting our throats blessed on St. Blaise Day are essential parts of our Catholic lineage. Each ceremony or ritual excites us, and elevates our hearts; we come away refreshed and with a sense that something beyond the ordinary has just happened, not just to us but to thousands of the faithful that same day in every corner of the world. These ritual actions are meant to draw us out of ourselves to encounter the Living God who loves us and is the author of all that is good.

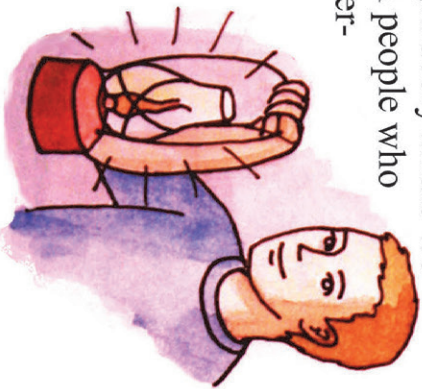


You are the Salt and Light!

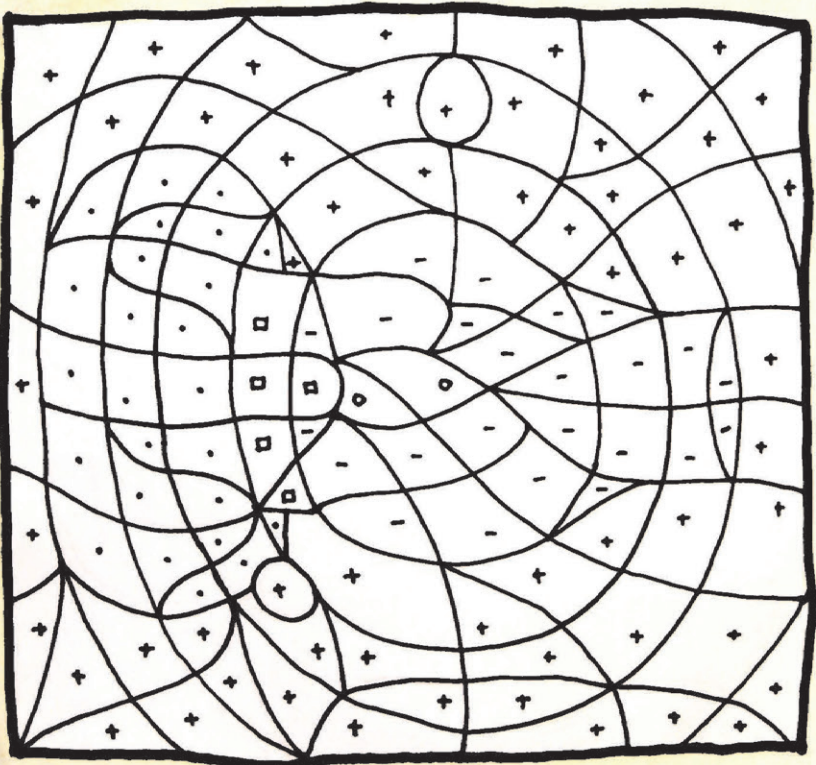

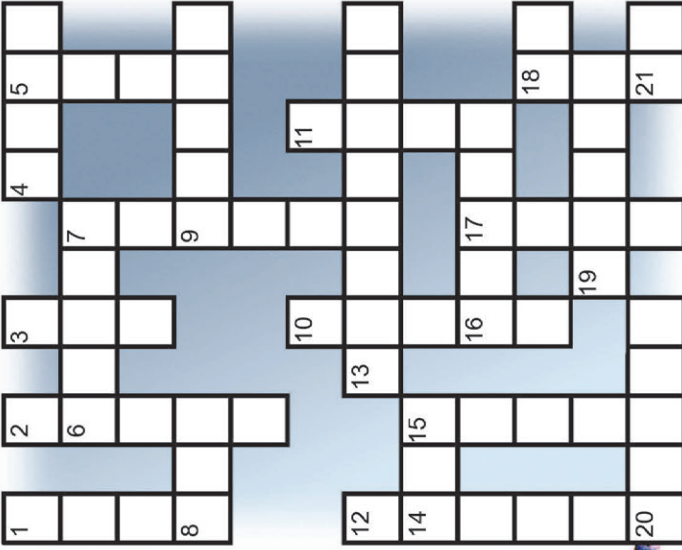
