SEMINARIAN'S TAKE

Hello all,

I have very exciting news to share with you all! Last week, I received a letter from Bishop Thomas calling me to the Order of the Diaconate. This means that I will be ordained on May 20, 2023. One cannot just become a priest by his own choosing. It requires prayer and guidance of the Holy Spirit. The call to orders is a letter that says that the Church has recognized in you the call of the Lord and thinks that you are fit for ordained ministry in the Church. It is the Church approving and confirming the call that I felt from the Lord.

Now, I am a Deacon-Candidate and will be ordained a deacon on May 20 at 10:00 a.m. in Our Lady Queen of the Most Holy Rosary Cathedral, Toledo. I would be most honored and humbled if you would be able to be present. One's ordination is not something that one chooses on his own. To be ordained, you must be approved by the Church. This is because your ministry is not for yourself; a priest is not his own. A priest is not a priest for his own sanctification, but for the sanctification of the people of God. A priest's life is for the service of others. That is why the Sacrament of Holy Orders requires formation and discernment. The Church wants men who will give their lives for the people of God.

In my own vocation, I felt the call from the Lord to give my life in this way. But the humbling truth of the matter is I did not arrive at this point on my own. I am able to present myself for the ministry of the Church, because of all the support and prayers that I have received from you. It is incredibly humbling to look back and see how God has worked through all of you and how you have helped form me to become a man for others. You have helped form me to be a deacon and one day a priest. My response to that is gratitude. I am incredibly grateful for each one of you and the role you have played in my life. You might think that you did not do much, but every interaction, no matter how small, has formed me. But even more important and powerful is your prayer. I would not be able to approach the altar for ordination without your prayers. Thank you.

I ask for your prayers in a special way as I prepare for ordination. Through the sacrament, my life will be conformed to Christ, the servant. My soul will be forever changed. I ask for your prayers that every area of my life will be conformed to Christ. The second thing I ask is that you pray for vocations and encourage men to think about a vocation. The Church needs good holy priests. It is our job to ask God to send out "labors in the harvest." So please pray for more vocations.

Finally, I again want to invite you to my ordination on May 20 at 10:00 a.m. in Holy Rosary Cathedral, Toledo. I would be greatly honored by your presence. If you have never been to an ordination, it is one of the most moving sacraments to witness. They don't happen that often, so I encourage you to come if you are able. Again, I ask for your prayers and be assured of mine.



When the St. Joseph school building was built in 1913, it had a temporary wooden ramp up to the doors. This was used until 1915 when the present steps were installed. You will notice that the

handrails on the north and west doors match. The south door handrail is newer because that door was used by the sisters as the old convent was right next to the St. Joseph building. The convent was torn down in 1939 when the sisters moved to the present convent (the old rectory).



DIOCESE OF TOLEDO IN COMPLIANCE FOLLOWING SAFE ENVIRONMENT AUDIT

The Diocese of Toledo participates in an annual audit to determine if our safe environment program, policies, and practices are in compliance with the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People. This year's audit was performed on-site for the audit period of July 1, 2018 through September 30, 2021.

On behalf of Bishop Thomas, I am happy to report that the Diocese of Toledo has been found to be in compliance with the articles of the Charter, based on the audit period of July 1, 2018 through September 30, 2021.

The Diocese of Toledo remains committed to ensuring the protection of children and providing a safe environment for all young people. Delphos Hosts Relics Touring Diocese

St. John the Evangelist Church in Delphos has been selected as a location for the veneration of the relics of two "Saints of the Eucharist." Throughout the day on April 16, first-class relics of Blessed Carlo Acutis and Saint Manuel Gonzalez Garcia will be honored at the Church. A schedule, including specific times for Mass, public Prayer Services and periods for personal prayer will be published in the near future.

Blessed Carlo Acutis

A young, modern saint of the Eucharist, this Italian boy has been named "Cyberapostle of the Eucharist." Carlo died of leukemia in 2006, at the age of 15. He played sports, video games, was a computer genius and designed a website documenting Eucharistic miracles. "To always be close to Jesus" was his life plan. He called the Eucharist "my highway to heaven." Although his parents were not practicing Catholics, Carlo was especially graced by God to practice an ardent faith. His witness influenced the conversion of his parents, who offered a reliquary containing his heart to the Cardinal officiating at his Beatification in Assisi in 2020. Google him – and discover much more about this great patron for our youth today!

Saint Manuel Gonzalez Garcia

This Spanish saint was an apostle of the Eucharist. As a young priest, he was assigned to a parish that was in disrepair both materially and spiritually. When he arrived, he went to the church, where he found the tabernacle covered in dust and cobwebs, the altar cloths torn and burnt, oil from the sanctuary lamp dripping on the floor. His church looked like an abandoned building. He wanted to run from the place and never look back. But he forced himself to remain. There, Jesus spoke to his heart. In that moment, everything changed. His life mission became clear: to bring souls to the Fountain of Love in the Blessed Sacrament. He met with Pope St. Pius X, who took a keen interest in his work for souls and especially his Eucharistic-centered mission. Father Manuel eventually became a Bishop and founded several Orders and ministries focusing on Eucharistic Adoration and Reparation. He is called the "Saint of the Abandoned Tabernacle" and was canonized in 2016 by Pope Francis.

Why do we venerate the relics of the saints?

Relics usually consist of the physical remains or personal effects of a saint (ex. a part of their body or clothing) which has been preserved as a memorial and offered for the veneration of the Faithful. Relics have been a part of Catholic tradition from earliest times and are tangible symbols of a life of deep holiness. Venerating the relics of saints is a beautiful practice that brings us close to those who walked before us. The saints are people like us who "ran the race" and reached their goal – heaven. Seeing their relics, praying before them and being blessed by them can move us to strive for holiness as they did. It is often said that answers to prayer are obtained at the sites where relics of the saints are placed and venerated. They remind us that we are in communion with those heroes of faith that went before us. Blessed Carlo and Saint Manuel, pray for us!
