SEMINARIAN'S TAKE

Hello All,

I wanted to take some time to talk about an old Lenten practice: The Stations of the Cross. The Stations of the Cross, also known as The Way of the Cross is a prayer in which we follow Christ from His trial before Pilate to his burial. The object of the Stations is to help the faithful to make in spirit, as it were, a pilgrimage to the chief scenes of Christ's sufferings and death. Where did this prayer come from? The devotion was developed during the Crusades when the knights and pilgrims began to follow the route of Christ's way to Calvary. This devotion spread throughout Europe and was promulgated by the Franciscan friars in the 14th and 15th centuries. Eventually, the Stations of the Cross became an important catechetical tool, and the popularity of this devotion inspired some of the greatest examples of medieval Christian art. Today, you will find the stations in every Catholic Church along the walls.

Why is this prayer important for each one of us? This prayer, as said above, is about making a spiritual pilgrimage with Jesus as He enters into His Passion and death. It is important for us to remember this great act of love that Jesus made for each one of us. This devotion keeps before us the central truth of our faith: That Jesus loved us and died for our sins in order that we might become children of God.

This devotion is more than just remembering Jesus' passion and death. It's also meant to help us in our own lives. Each one of us has a cross we are carrying in life and often these crosses are hidden from those around us. Our cross in life can often be incredibly lonely since we are the only ones who can carry it. Because of this, it is very easy to get discouraged by the spiritual weight of our sufferings and trials; this is where the devotion of the Stations of the Cross comes in. The Stations of the Cross is a great prayer, because when we pray it we are carrying our cross next to the only one who can understand our pain: Jesus Christ. We carry our cross with Christ as we go through each station, we place ourselves in the scene with Jesus as He goes through each trial. The Stations of the Cross can provide us comfort and encouragement in our own crosses of life. I encourage you this Lent to take up this devotion. As a child, I remember praying it every Friday in Lent with my whole family. Perhaps you can pray this with your family, with the parish community, or even on your own. It is a powerful prayer that has the ability to strengthen you in your own spiritual journey to Calvary. Below are the times for the Stations at our parishes during Lent:

- Delphos, St. John: Wednesdays at 7:30 p.m.
- Spencerville, St. Patrick: Tuesday at 6:30 p.m. (There is Adoration with a short reflection by the seminarian after Stations.)
- Landeck, St. John the Baptist: Mondays at 6:30 p.m.

On February 28, 1872, Bishop Richard Gilmour was made the second bishop of Cleveland, Ohio. He was born on September 28, 1824, in Glasgow, Scotland. He laid the cornerstone of our present church in 1879, dedicated our present church in 1881, and blessed the St. Marys school building in 1888. Bishop Gilmour died in St. Augustine, FL on April 13, 1891. He is buried in St. John Cathedral, Cleveland. Visit

Jesus Shows His Glory



BISHOP DANIEL THOMAS DISPENSES FROM THE OBLIGATION TO ABSTAIN FROM MEAT ON FRIDAY, MARCH 17, 2023

Out of pastoral solicitude, Bishop Daniel Thomas has decided to dispense the faithful of the Diocese of Toledo, whether actually present in the territory or not, from the obligation to abstain from meat on Friday, March 17, 2023, the memorial of Saint Patrick. Catholics present in the Diocese of Toledo who otherwise reside in another diocese, are likewise dispensed. No member of the faithful is required to make use of this dispensation, however, those who choose to do so are strongly encouraged to abstain from meat on some other day that week as part of their penitential practices during Lent.


