SEMINARIAN'S TAKE

Greetings!

We have made it to Holy Week! Whether you have been faithful or not in keeping your Lenten practices; whether this has been an enriching or a dry and challenging Lent; we are coming to the end. This last week is an opportunity to enter into the Passion with Jesus. Holy Week is a great time to walk with Jesus as we remember the last days of His life. It's a time for us to prayerfully walk the last moments of Jesus' life. St. Leo the Great says, "True reverence for the Lord's Passion means fixing the eyes of our heart; on Jesus crucified and recognizing in Him our own humanity." What he means is that we need to see in Christ our own humanity as we reflect on the Passion. We all have crosses in our life, so praying with passion teaches us how to carry them. There are opportunities to do that throughout Holy Week.

Tuesday is the Chrism Mass which takes place in the Cathedral with the Bishop. All are invited to attend or you can livestream it. This Mass is important because it is in this Mass that the Holy Oils for the sacraments are blessed and distributed to the parishes throughout the diocese. These oils are used in the Sacraments that bring salvation and healing. It's an important Mass for priests because they renew their unity and obedience to the Bishop.

Wednesday is called "Spy Wednesday" because tradition has it that this is the day Judas made the deal with the Pharisees to hand over Jesus for 30 pieces of silver. A service called Tenebrae is sometimes celebrated. Tenebrae means "darkness." This darkness symbolizes the abandonment of Jesus by His disciples and anticipates the anguish and tragedy of Good Friday later on in Holy Week. This is a day to fast and to pray, asking God that we do not betray Him like Judas. It is also a time to comfort Jesus as His trial approaches. Deacon Gene will lead a Tenebrae service on Wednesday at 7:30 p.m. at St. John the Evangelist.

Thursday-Saturday: Triduum. Holy Thursday starts what is called the Triduum and it will end with the Easter Vigil on Saturday night. It is one liturgy from Holy Thursday till Easter Saturday.

Holy Thursday is remembered by the Mass of the Lord's Supper. At this celebration, the Church reenacts all that took place "on the night that Jesus was betrayed" – the institution of the Holy Eucharist by Jesus, the gift of the priesthood, and our call to serve each other symbolized by Jesus washing the feet of His disciples. After the Mass, we have a period of adoration of our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. It is a day to give thanks for the Eucharist and the priesthood.

Good Friday is the day of Christ's death. When we visit a church on Good Friday, the Blessed Sacrament is absent, crosses have been veiled or removed, the altar is bare and no holy water is at the door. We can feel the "emptiness" and the "darkness" in the church. We solemnly celebrate the liturgy of the Passion and the Death of our Lord on Good Friday at 3:00 p.m., the time when Our Lord died on the cross. On the edge of sadness, all seems lost on Good Friday – "darkness has come over the whole land." The darkness which began on Wednesday has now conquered the light. This is a solemn day, one in which we ask God for forgiveness for our sins which put Jesus to death.

Holy Saturday is a day of waiting. This is the moment of waiting. We can place ourselves with the disciples left in dark uncertainty. But unlike the disciples, we know what comes next. So, today is a day of expectant waiting. Waiting for the light of the Resurrection to return. Waiting for the Easter candle announcing that the darkness has not overcome the light. The Resurrection brings with it a new day of light in which all darkness is defeated.


SCAMMERS ARE AT IT AGAIN



AN INVITATION

Reflection on Matthew 26:14–27:66

The Palm Sunday Liturgy begins on the upbeat, with Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, but dissolves into mayhem as the Passion story unfolds. By hearing today the entire Passion story of Jesus, we are invited to enter into the holiest week of the year, when we will hear and celebrate this same story in its essential parts as we move from Holy Thursday, through Good Friday, the Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday.

As we give thanks for God's mercy embodied in Jesus and His great gift of self, we are invited into the story, to allow Jesus' suffering, death and Resurrection to interpret our lives. There is so much here to pause with and reflect on: friendship and betrayal, our personal depths of sinfulness and violence, fear and social pressure, greed and lust for power. As we take ownership of our need for redemption, our individual stories merge with the story of Jesus. We walk the same path together, through death to new life.

WEEKLY SCRIPTURE
