SEMINARIAN'S TAKE

Greetings!

We have made it to Holy Week! Whether you have been faithful or not in keeping your Lenten practices; whether this has been an enriching or a dry and challenging Lent; we are coming to the end. This last week is an opportunity to enter into the Passion with Jesus. Holy Week is a great time to walk with Jesus as we remember the last days of His life. It's a time for us to prayerfully walk the last moments of Jesus' life. St. Leo the Great says, "True reverence for the Lord's Passion means fixing the eyes of our heart; on Jesus crucified and recognizing in Him our own humanity." What he means is that we need to see in Christ our own humanity as we reflect on the Passion. We all have crosses in our life, so praying with passion teaches us how to carry them. There are opportunities to do that throughout Holy Week.

Tuesday is the Chrism Mass which takes place in the Cathedral with the Bishop. All are invited to attend or you can livestream it. This Mass is important because it is in this Mass that the Holy Oils for the sacraments are blessed and distributed to the parishes throughout the diocese. These oils are used in the Sacraments that bring salvation and healing. It's an important Mass for priests because they renew their unity and obedience to the Bishop.

Wednesday is called "Spy Wednesday" because tradition has it that this is the day Judas made the deal with the Pharisees to hand over Jesus for 30 pieces of silver. A service called Tenebrae is sometimes celebrated. Tenebrae means "darkness." This darkness symbolizes the abandonment of Jesus by His disciples and anticipates the anguish and tragedy of Good Friday later on in Holy Week. This is a day to fast and to pray, asking God that we do not betray Him like Judas. It is also a time to comfort Jesus as His trial approaches. Deacon Gene will lead a Tenebrae service on Wednesday at 7:30 p.m. at St. John the Evangelist.

Thursday-Saturday: Triduum. Holy Thursday starts what is called the Triduum and it will end with the Easter Vigil on Saturday night. It is one liturgy from Holy Thursday till Easter Saturday.

Holy Thursday is remembered by the Mass of the Lord's Supper. At this celebration, the Church reenacts all that took place "on the night that Jesus was betrayed" – the institution of the Holy Eucharist by Jesus, the gift of the priesthood, and our call to serve each other symbolized by Jesus washing the feet of His disciples. After the Mass, we have a period of adoration of our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. It is a day to give thanks for the Eucharist and the priesthood.

Good Friday is the day of Christ's death. When we visit a church on Good Friday, the Blessed Sacrament is absent, crosses have been veiled or removed, the altar is bare and no holy water is at the door. We can feel the "emptiness" and the "darkness" in the church. We solemnly celebrate the liturgy of the Passion and the Death of our Lord on Good Friday at 3:00 p.m., the time when Our Lord died on the cross. On the edge of sadness, all seems lost on Good Friday – "darkness has come over the whole land." The darkness which began on Wednesday has now conquered the light. This is a solemn day, one in which we ask God for forgiveness for our sins which put Jesus to death.

Holy Saturday is a day of waiting. This is the moment of waiting. We can place ourselves with the disciples left in dark uncertainty. But unlike the disciples, we know what comes next. So, today is a day of expectant waiting. Waiting for the light of the Resurrection to return. Waiting for the Easter candle announcing that the darkness has not overcome the light. The Resurrection brings with it a new day of light in which all darkness is defeated.

PALM/PASSION SUNDAY, April 2, 2023

+ Masses at 4:30 p.m. on Saturday, and 7:30, 9:15 and 11:30 a.m. on Sunday. Palms will be blest at all Masses. "The Palms should be taken home where they will serve as a symbol of the victory of Christ and protect our homes and workplaces."

Wednesday, April 5, 2023

+ 7:30 p.m. TENEBRAE

This service recalls the suffering of Christ in the Garden of Olives and in His Passion. This ceremony is held in semi-darkness with singing, prayer and Scripture that enters into Christ's sorrow and yet proclaims the Resurrection.

Thursday, April 6, 2023

+ 7:30 p.m.: MASS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

We begin the Sacred Triduum, the three Holy Days, with the washing of feet and the institution of the Holy Eucharist and commissioning of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. There will be time for private prayer before the Blessed Sacrament until 10:00 p.m.

Masses are at 7:30, 9:15 and 11:30 a.m. This day completes the Paschal Mystery, the Sacred Triduum, the holy days of Christ's suffering, death and Resurrection. We who have entered into the suffering and death with Jesus Christ shall also celebrate His triumphant rising from the dead.

Holy Week

Did you know that this week is the most important one in the whole year? Holy Week has Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday. On these days we remember and celebrate the most important things that Jesus did before His resurrection on Easter Sunday.

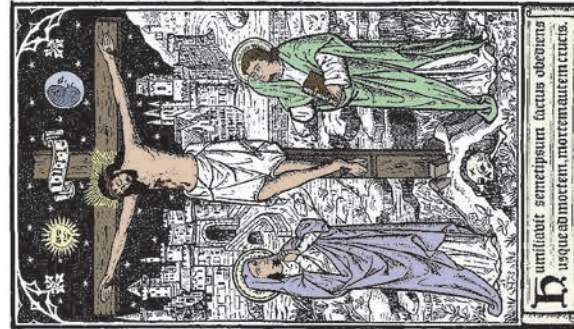
On Holy Thursday Jesus said the first Mass and made his apostles the first priests. Go to Mass on Thursday if you can, and think about what Jesus did- He made bread and wine into Himself so that He could still be with us after He went back into Heaven.

On Good Friday Jesus suffered terribly and then died on the cross because of our sins. He offered up His life, even though He had never sinned, so that all of us could go to Heaven. That's why we call it "Good" Friday. Can you offer some sacrifice to Jesus in return for what He did for you?

On Holy Saturday Jesus' body was in the tomb. His friends were all shocked by what had happened and were afraid and sad. They did not remember what was going to happen next... Do you remember what happened after Holy Saturday?

On Good Friday JESUS was taken before King HEROD and the governor, PILATE. Even though He had not

committed any crime He was scourged and condemned to die on the CROSS. He CARRIED the cross as far as He could up CALVARY hill, but when He got too weak a man named

SIMON of CYRENE was forced to help Him. On the way He met His mother, MARY, who WEPT at seeing her Son in such pain. A woman named VERONICA wiped the blood and

sweat from His face with a cloth. At the top of the HILL Jesus was thrown onto the cross and His HANDS and FEET were fastened to it with NAILS. They raised the cross, where Jesus hung for three hours before He DIED. He did all this to SAVE us from Hell. At the cross were JOHN, Mary MAGDALENE, His mother, and some other women. At the moment He died the curtain of the old Temple was TORN in half. When His body was taken down from the cross JOSEPH of Arimathea and NICODEMUS BURIED Him in a new TOMB and rolled a HEAVY STONE in front of the door.

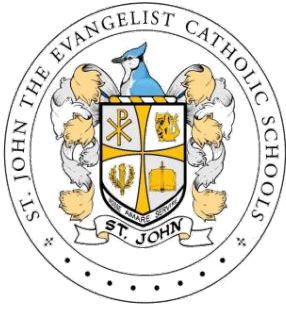
