That same year, he had the present slate roof installed with copper nails and a new downspout system was also installed. The stone facing was restored in 1979 and has been restored about every 20 years ever since then.

SEMINARIAN'S TAKE

Greetings friends,

Time has flown by! I cannot believe that my time here has come to an end so fast. I am sad to leave; I have thoroughly enjoyed my time here. While it is sad to leave, my heart is filled with gratitude for the chance to be a part of these wonderful communities. I thank you for welcoming me into your homes and lives. I am thankful for the opportunity to laugh, eat, work, and minister with you.

I am of the belief that while seminary is important and teaches me about the priesthood, but it is you, the people of God, who teach me about how to be a priest. So I am grateful for your help in forming me and teaching me to become a priest. It is from being with you this year that I have begun to learn truly what it means to be a parish priest. Thank you for that.

When you say "yes" to God, He will lead you to places you would never imagine. In saying "yes" to following God and His invitation to this vocation, He has taken me to many different places and brought me many different people into my life. In saying "yes" to God, He has brought me to Landeck, Delphos, and Spencerville. I came to these parishes not really knowing much about them but I leave feeling that they are very much my family. It was definitely God's will that I come here for I have learned and grown so much. I offer this final word of reflection: Always say "yes" to God. His plans will always be greater than your plans. He will lead you to places you would never have thought possible and He will bring some of the most wonderful people into your life. It can be scary and challenging to give up our plans but when we say "yes" to God, we are made free. I, thus, challenge each of you in your own life, look and see where God is inviting you to follow His plans and I encourage you to respond "yes!"

What is next in store for me: my assignment here ends on May 1st. April 30th will be my last weekend in Landeck and Spencerville. I will stick around to pack up with my last weekend in Delphos being May 7th. After my time here, I will spend some time with family and then prepare for ordination to the diaconate on May 20th. After ordination, I will start a summer program called CPE in which I will be trained as a hospital chaplain. Finally in September, I will return to Rome for my final year of formation; thus, God willing, I will be ordained a priest the following summer.

Again, I am so grateful for all you have done for me and I will be praying for you. I ask that you pray for me, especially as I prepare for ordination. I will forever be grateful to God for the chance to be a part of the parishes of St. John the Evangelist, St. Patrick, and St. John the Baptist.



The Good Shepherd




The readings in today's Mass talk about Jesus the Good Shepherd. In Jesus' time, and still in some parts of the world today, there would be flocks of sheep grazing




