

THIS WEEK IN PARISH HISTORY By: Jack Bockey



In 1860, parish groups were organized which included the St. Joseph Society and the Young Ladies' and Young Men's Sodalities. The St. Joseph Society enrolled the married men of the parish and they donated the Ascension window on the north side of church. The Young Ladies' Sodality was dedicated to the Blessed Virgin and they donated the Assumption window on the north side of church. The Young Men's Sodality was dedicated to St. Aloysius. The Young Ladies' & Men's Sodalities were affiliated with parent Sodalities in Rome and were formed to foster high standards of Catholic morality and an appreciation of the Catholic faith among the members.






