SEMINARIAN'S TAKE

Hi all!

This week, we celebrate the feast day of two of my favorite saints! On August 28th, we celebrate St. Augustine and on August 27th, St. Monica. It is important to find and have saints who are your favorite because saints are more than just holy people from history; saints are our friends and guides. Saints are people who lived before

us and now live heavenly communion with Mary and the Trinity. As you know, when we profess in the creed that “we believe in the communion of saints” we believe that these holy people who have gone before us are still a part of the community of believers – they are still connected to us. Yes, the saints lived years before us, but they are still connected in a real spiritual way. We can have a relationship with them and pray for their help and learn from their lives. Saints can be our spiritual friends, and just like other people, we will find saints with stories and personalities connect with us better than others. For me, there are many saints I love and am connected with. The saints I shared with today are saints I love and have a connection with. I came to love St. Monica because my mother loved her and passed her devotion to me. St. Augustine, I came to love because his life is real and messy and easy to relate to. I encourage you to find a saint that you love and learn their story and make them a part of your life!

St. Monica is the mother of St. Augustine, and she is the patron saint of Mothers. Through her prayers and tears to God, she helped convert her husband and son. Her husband was pagan and hated her piety and prayers, he often became angry with her. Her son Augustine was born in 354. He grew up to be an ambitious young man and while he was instructed in the Christian faith, he did not have any care for the Church. He went off to Rome to study rhetoric and began to be consumed in the pleasures of the world. He was focused on being successful and loving all the pleasures that life could offer him. He lived a life of revelry and lust, which caused him to drift farther from the Church. His poor mother Monica prayed tirelessly and sought a bishop for help. The Bishop said to her, “Don’t worry, it is impossible that a son of so many tears should be lost.” So, she prayed unceasingly for her husband and Augustine’s conversion. Augustine began his journey of conversion when he met St. Ambros, bishop of Milan who through his preaching helped Augustine in his search for truth. Augustine fully converted and was baptized after reading St. Paul’s epistle to the Romans. Monica’s prayers were answered through her perseverance and patient love – both her husband and Augustine converted to Catholicism. Augustine went on to become a bishop and one of the greatest western theologians and defenders of the faith.

Both of these saints are great examples for us in our own lives of faith. St. Monica, the patron saint of mothers, can be an example for parents and grandparents who have wayward children. Monica knows the pain of a child who rejects the family and the faith, yet she never gave up hope but rather continued to pray for her loved ones. Her prayer is a witness to the power of prayer which is greater than any action or word. So, when situations in our family circle seem hopeless, let us turn to St. Monica and ask for her intercession. St. Augustine is a great example as well because he shows us that no matter how far we stray from God, He is always there to call us back to Himself and the Church. Augustine shows us that the road to sainthood is not always smooth and that God can make good come from our mistakes. So, let us be encouraged on our own road to holiness from St. Augustine’s example. We may fall down and sin, but we should be encouraged to always get back up and return to God who is waiting for us. As St. Augustine famously said, “our hearts are restless until they rest in you, Lord.” Nothing in this world can satisfy us except for Jesus Christ, so let our hearts seek to rest in Him. St. Augustine and St. Monica, pray for us!

REFLECTIONS ON THE EUCHARIST

Jesus knowing that His hour had come, that He should pass out of this world to the Father: having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them unto the end (John 13:1). A father who is about to die wishes to leave his children a supreme proof of his love for them. Often such a father cannot find words to express his love and he remains silent with a silence that is more eloquent than speech. When Jesus was about to die, He found not only the word to express His meaning but also the words that would make His meaning a reality, the words of transubstantiation. He gave us the Eucharist as a testament, and in this sacrament He left to us His own divine Person...

True and generous love, by which we wish others well and do them good, leads us to bend down toward them if they are below us. It inspires us to unite ourselves to them in perfect union of thought, desire, and will to devote ourselves to them, to sacrifice ourselves if necessary to make them better, and encourage them to reach out beyond themselves and attain their destiny.

When our Lord was about to deprive us of His sensible presence, He wished to leave Himself to us in person under the Eucharistic veils. Loving us as He did, He could not bend down any lower toward us, toward the lowliest, the poorest... There was no way by which He could unite Himself or give Himself more completely to each of us.

There are times when we yearn for the real presence of loved ones who are no more. The Eucharistic Heart of the Savior has given us the real presence of His Body, His Blood, His Soul, and His Divinity. Everywhere on earth wherever there is a consecrated host in a tabernacle, even in the most far flung missions, He remains with us, the sweet companion of our exile. He is in each tabernacle, patiently waiting for us, eager to grant us favors, yearning for our prayers...
