BLESSING OF CANDLES

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, commonly known as Candlemas Day, will be celebrated on Sunday, February 2. The blessing of candles, used for church and for individual homes, will take place immediately before all the Masses in Delphos, Landeck and Spencerville on that day. If you have candles you want blessed for your devotional use at home, please bring them to Mass. You can keep them near you in your pew. Blessed candles celebrate Christ as the Light of the World and His abiding presence with us!

BLESSING OF THROATS

On Monday, February 3, the feast of St. Blaise, a 4th century Bishop and Martyr, there will be an individual blessing of throats at the 8:00 a.m. Mass at Delphos St. John the Evangelist and the 7:00 p.m. Mass at Landeck St. John the Baptist Churches. This long-standing tradition has its roots in the life of St. Blaise who, on his way to martyrdom, miraculously cured a young boy who was choking on a fish bone. The blessing asks that the recipient be delivered from any illness of the throat and every other illness. It will take place after the General Intercessions.

THIS WEEK IN PARISH HISTORY



Fr. John Otto Bredeick was born on January 22, 1789 in the Town of Verl, Germany. Here are some fun facts about Fr. Bredeick. When he was about 22, he almost joined the military to help shake off the French rule and fight for the freedom of Germany. Records show he saw no fighting, however, as he was found totally unfit for military service because of a stiff joint

in his right elbow. In 1822, Fr. Bredeick was ordained a priest on November 4 in St. Peter Cathedral in Osnabruck, Germany. Before Fr. Bredeick came to America, he was the rector of the cathedral in Osnabruck. In 1843, he sent his brother Frederick to America to find land for a new Catholic settlement. Fr. Bredeick came to America in 1844 and founded our parish on October 18th. In 1851, he named what had been known as the Ten Mile woods, Delphos, from the Greek word "brother." He died on August 19, 1858.

SGO - SCHOLARSHIP GRANTING ORGANIZATION

As last year, you will again have the ability to direct your tax dollars to support St. John the Evangelist Catholic School through a Scholarship Fund of the Diocese of Toledo - a Scholarship Granting Organization or SGO. As we develop the plan to get additional information to you, we wanted to, at the very least, get you thinking about this as 2025 is here and tax preparation will be underway before we know it. Reminder: With the SGO, a taxpayer will receive a tax credit up to \$750.00 for State income taxes paid. A tax credit will not exceed the taxes paid or \$750.00, whichever is less. Married couples filing jointly may give up to \$1,500.00. The tax credit for married couples filing jointly will not exceed the taxes paid or \$1,500.00, whichever is less. We do suggest you consult your tax preparer on how you would benefit from this tax credit. Again, additional information will be coming soon! However, if you would like to take advantage of the SGO now, you may do so online through

this QR code and follow the steps necessary. Be sure to select St. John, Delphos (to endure 100% of your donation stays with us):

SAINT FRANCIS DE SALES

Saint of the Day: January 24

Patron Saint of Authors, Deafness, Journalists and Writers

Francis was ordained and elected provost of the Diocese of Geneva, then a center for the Calvinists. Francis set out to convert them by preaching and distributing the little pamphlets he wrote to explain true Catholic doctrine. He had remarkable success.


At 35, he became bishop of Geneva. While administering his diocese, he continued to preach, hear Confessions, and catechize the children. His gentle character was a great asset in winning souls. He practiced his own axiom, "A spoonful of honey attracts more flies than a barrelful of vinegar."

Besides his two well-known books, the *Introduction to the Devout Life* and A *Treatise* on the Love of God, he wrote many pamphlets and carried on a vast correspondence. His writings, filled with his characteristic gentle spirit, are addressed to lay people. He wants to make them understand that they, too, are called to be saints.

In spite of his busy and comparatively short life, he had time to collaborate with another saint, Jane Frances de Chantal, in the work of establishing the Sisters of the Visitation. These women were to practice the virtues exemplified in Mary's visit to Elizabeth: humility, piety, and mutual charity. They at first engaged, to a limited degree, in works of mercy for the poor and the sick. Today, while some communities conduct schools, others live a strictly contemplative life.

Francis de Sales took seriously the words of Christ, "Learn of me for I am meek and humble of heart." As he said himself, it took him 20 years to conquer his quick temper, but no one ever suspected he had such a problem, so overflowing with good nature and kindness was his usual manner of acting. His perennial meekness and sunny disposition won for him the title of "Gentleman Saint."






